Year 11 Classes and Setting

Your child may have changed classes or moved sets since their Trial Exam results in Year 10. This information will be shown on your child's timetable. All setting decisions are made in the best interests of your child, but if you do have any further questions in relation to this, then please don't hesitate to contact your child's tutor, or our Learning Directors for English, maths and science. For your information, this is what the class codes on your child's timetable mean:

















English – all classes are taught in 'mixed ability' groupings. Groups 1 and 2 might have a higher number of students who have achieved highly in the past but there is no 'higher' or 'foundation' tier.

Maths – maths classes are put into sets from 1 to 5. Sets 1 and 2 follow the Higher Tier (grades 4-9) and sets 3 to 5 follow the Foundation Tier (grades 1-5).

Science – science classes are put into sets from 1 to 5. Set 1 follow the Higher Tier (grades 4-9) and sets 2 to 5 follow the Foundation Tier (grades 1-5).

Please note that following the Trial Exams this term, it may be that some students are moved from the Foundation to Higher tiers and vice versa if they show potential to improve, or if they are at risk of a U grade. This will be communicated with your child individually by their class teacher or Learning Director.

Support and Opportunities for Year 11

We aim to enhance the Year 11 experience by providing opportunities for both our parents and students. You will find a summary below that details the main events that will take place this year. Of course, we are all aware of the final GCSE exams that will soon be upon us in May, so it is important to us that we give our students the best opportunities to prepare for these. We will hold two sets of Trial Exams during November and March that all students will sit. These will be enhanced by a post-exams programme of providing students with the experience of Results Day, and providing Personalised Learning Checklists (PLCs) which identify areas of strength and weakness for you and your child to create a topic-based revision programme.

Students will have the opportunity to receive mentoring, and this will be bespoke depending on an individual's needs. Mentoring could take place to help a student improve in a particular subject, a need to increase effort within or outside the classroom, or to support with wellbeing and coping with exam stress. Some of this mentoring will come from the creation of subject specialist tutor groups which we will be launching following the November Trial Exams, depending on individual student needs. From October half-term, we will also be launching competitions for all students who use our Century Tech platform.

After School Revision

Finally, you will have received a letter from Mr Anakwa with the full details of our period 6 revision timetable beginning from Monday 12th September. We will be creating a bespoke timetable for your child which can be seen on your child's school timetable. Your child should use their end of Year 10 Trial Exam results to help them decide which revision sessions to prioritise.
