Elective Programme

Our new Electives programme was launched Period 5 on Wednesday 11 September. This is an opportunity for all staff and students to experience something different once a week under one of three main themes: Physical and Adventurous; Creative or Cultural. We have 45 different activities taking place from quiet reading groups to creating a KC newspaper; from trampolining to golf; from learning Japanese to understanding crime investigations – there is something for everyone and a chance to work with students across different year groups at the same time. Each activity lasts one full term so students have the opportunity to participate in three different activities, one from each main theme over the academic year. On Wednesday 2 October Orbis Trust completed a Quality Assurance walk of the Electives and the feedback was extremely positive "The entire school staff should be congratulated for delivering a whole school Electives programme". Our social media has reported on some of the activities taking place and photographs of some of the work KC students have produced. We have even had outside speakers in to talk to Aptitude Music, drama and dance groups alongside those participating in the Musical Theatre elective about working in the music industry and being scouted.
















P.E

It's been a really busy first half term in the PE department, where we have faced much disruption with weather, but nonetheless we've managed to keep the students active!

All KS3 students have completed their first block of work. Year 9 have moved onto their second activity, whilst Years 7 and 8 have been working on a short block of Fitness. Through their fitness work, they have explored different components of fitness – how these components are required in different sporting contexts and how they might be trained or tested.

KS4 students have been completing their first block of work, focusing on games play, rules and tactics, ready to start their new activities after the half term break.

We have been building our extra-curricular provision, with numbers of students attending our lunchtime and after school clubs increasing. Below is the timetable of activities. There is no need to sign up for any of the activities. For lunchtime clubs, simply bring trainers to change into, these clubs are recreational. PE kit is required for after school sessions, which are more focused on training for competitions. These run from 3.15-4.15pm, 3pm-4pm on a Wednesday.


Overall, the afternoon was a huge success, and the student's left feeling inspired.

Careers Fair

On Thursday 10th October, we held our first careers fair since COVID. We had seven exhibitors from a range of companies and organisations including colleges, universities and the Armed Forces. All students in Years 9, 11, 12 and 13 got the chance to find out more about each exhibitor and the opportunities they offer post-16 and post-18 in terms of Further Education and jobs.

There was a great buzz to the event, with many students exploring options such as apprenticeships and courses that they hadn't previously considered.

<u>Geography</u>

September saw the Geography department take the Year 13 Geographers to the Norfolk coastline as an opportunity to see geographical processes in action, and to collect their own individual primary data. We completed a scavenger hunt of human and physical processes, and saw coastal management being installed in Cromer, before spending the next day in Sheringham where we were based for our stay. This day saw the geographers investigate the impacts of coastal management, land use change and environmental impacts of the local area. On the way back we visited Norwich where data collection involved environmental quality surveys and questionnaires about changes over time. It was lovely to see the students be independent and take charge of their individual investigations -well done all.









Year 11 Geography students have completed their fieldwork for Component 3 of their exam. Students visited Northampton University not only to complete an investigation on sustainability but to also participate in a Geography taster session with staff from the University. Students participated in a tour and learnt how to use a theodolite to measure angles as well as play the trade game to learn more about the increasing global connections and inequalities in development. For their fieldwork, students visited five sites around the university collecting primary data through environmental quality surveys, field sketches and observations to help them to understand whether or not the redevelopment of the University was sustainable. Despite some heavy downpours on the second day of fieldwork, all students were able to successfully collect their data and now have a greater understanding of what it might be like to study at the University of Northampton.







Antarctic Flags Project

The British Antarctic Survey take the flags to Antarctica on behalf of UK Polar Network and some beautiful photographs of the stunning Antarctic landscape are taken. Their aim during this visit was to investigate chocolate box lids and visual identities of the different chocolate brands.

The class had lots of fun learning about the history of John Cadbury and how he started his career as a grocer. Amongst groceries, he sold cocoa and drinking chocolate - which he prepared himself, using a mortar and pestle; this became very popular. The students also visited the Bournville museum in which they could explore a range of branding and packaging material for inspiration.

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed sampling a range of free chocolate bars throughout the trip and writing their name in chocolate. We also dived into a bowl of liquid Cadbury Dairy Milk, road the Crunchie Rollercoaster, whilst firing at several coco beans and finally we endured an adventurous journey in the 4D Chocolate Adventure cinema experience, with motion seats and with a lot of screaming boys!

We finished the day with an iMedia talk from Cadburys. The students learnt further about product equites, why branding is important, hidden meaning within logos, colour psychology and the use of slogans.
