

Introduction

As the trust of which your school is a part, we need to use information about you. We do this for a number of reasons. This notice tells you what information we use about you and why we use it. It is very important that information about you is kept safe. We explain, below, how the school keeps your information safe.

If you want to know anything about what we do with information about you then please ask your form tutor/head of year, or speak to your parents/carers and ask them to contact the school. The school wants you to feel free to raise any questions at all.

We, also, have a person called the Data Protection Officer (DPO) for the trust. They can answer any questions you have about what the school does with your information. If you or your parents/carers want to speak to them, our DPO is:

Policy Statement

Whilst you attend school, we will use information that we gather in relation to you for various purposes. Information that we hold in relation to you is known as 'personal data'. This will include data that we obtain from you directly and data about you that we obtain from other people and organisations. We might, also, need to continue to hold personal data for a period of time after you have left the school. Anything that we do with personal data is known as 'processing'.

This document sets out what personal data we will hold, why we process that data, who we share this information with, and your rights as individuals in relation to your personal data processed by us.

What information do we use about you?

We will collect, hold, share and otherwise use information about you set out in the boxes below:

• Name	• Telephone and email contact details	• Date of Birth

We will, also, collect, hold, share and otherwise use some information about you which is 'special category personal data' and we will take extra care to make sure that this is kept safe:

Where do we get this information from?

We get this information from:

- you;
- your parents/carers;
- teachers and other staff;
- people from other organisations, like doctors or the local authority.

Why do we use this information?

We use this information for lots of reasons, including:

- to make sure that we give you a good education and to support you through this;
- to make sure that we are able to address and support any educational, health or social needs you may have;
- to make sure everyone is treated fairly and equally;
- to keep you and everyone at school safe and secure;
- to deal with emergencies involving you;
- to celebrate your achievements;
- to provide reports and additional information to your parents/carers.

Some of these things we have to do by law. Other things we do because we need to so that we can run your school. Sometimes we need permission to use your information. This includes taking pictures or videos of you to be used on our website, our social media, or in other publications. Before we do these things we will ask you or if necessary your parent/carer for permission.

Why do we use special category personal data?

We may need to use the information about you which is special (mentioned above) where there is a specific interest to do so, for example health and social care purposes or to provide you with equal opportunities and treatment. We will also use this information where you have given us permission to do so.

There may, also, be circumstances where we need to use your information in relation to legal claims, or to protect your vital interests and where you are unable to provide your consent.

How long will we hold information in relation to our students?

We will hold information relating to you only for as long as necessary. How long we need to hold on to any information will depend on the type of information. Where you change school we will usually pass your information to your new school.

Who will we share student information with?

We may share information about you with:

- other schools or educational institutions you may attend or require support from;
- local authorities, to help them carry out their responsibilities in relation to education and training, youth support and safeguarding purposes;
- the Department for Education, as required by the law;
- contractors, to enable them to provide an effective service to your school, such as school meal providers or external tutors.

Keeping this information safe

It is very important that only people who need to use your information can see it. Your school keeps your information safe by storing most of it electronically on our information management system which is password protected. Other information is kept securely on our computer systems or in secure locations.

Your rights in relation to your information

You can ask to see the information we hold about you. If you wish to do this, you should contact your tutor/head of year in the first instance.

You, also, have the right to:

- object to what we are doing with your information;
- have inaccurate or incomplete information about you amended;
- ask us to stop doing certain things with your information in some cases;
- ask that decisions about you are not made using automatic systems;
- claim against the school in certain circumstances where you have suffered as a result of your school breaching your data protection rights.

If you feel it necessary to do any of the above, you should speak with your tutor/head of year in the first instance.

Your school does not have to meet all of your requests and we will let you know where we are unable to do so.

Concerns

If you are concerned about how we are using your personal data then you can speak with your form tutor/head of year or, if necessary, Mr Roberts, Data Protection Officer (DPO).
